Nature Collage Activity

	(1) roll of double sided tape / student (to stick nature objects to card stock)
	(5) bottles of elmer's glue (to paint onto cardstock and sprinkle soil)
	(1) dixie cup / student (for teachers to distribute the glue and students to
	paint out of)
	(1) paint brush / student (for glue or mud)
	(1) snack bag of loamy soil or fine sand / students
	(1) paper lunch bag (for collecting nature objects)
Suggested Nature Objects to look for outside:	
	Any nature works. Get creative!
	Leaves
	Flowers
	Grass / Ornamental grass
	Twigs / sticks
	Pine Needles
	Pine Cones
	 Pine cone scales
	Dirt / soil
	 Sand
	Rocks / pebbles
	 Whatever is available nearby

Objectives:

- 1.) Students will observe and collect "natural" objects.
- 2.) Students will create a collage / or image using mostly natural objects found nearby.

Method:

Students will go outside with their paper lunch bag to collect small objects for the nature collage.

Background:

Nature is all around us, just outside the door! By collecting natural objects and creating a nature collage or art project, it will bring the student's focus back to nature.

Activity:

Before the activity:

- 1. Have students sit at a desk or outside to complete their Nature Collage.
- 2. Each student should start with:
 - a. 1 piece of cardstock
 - b. 1 small cup of glue
 - c. 1 paint brush
 - d. 1 roll of double sided tape
 - e. 1 snack bag of soil
 - f. 1 empty paper lunch bag for collecting nature items

Procedure:

- 1. Ask the students what kind of nature objects they think they could find right outside the school or house.
 - a. Grass, leaves, trees, twigs, soil, water, pinecones, sap, etc.
- 2. Tell the students they will be watching a short video that shows instructions of how to gather nature objects, and attach them onto cardstock to create a Nature Collage.
- 3. Challenge them to be creative!

Video Outline:

1. Introduction

- a. I'm Adam with the Lower Platte South Natural Resources District, here to remind you that nature is all around us.
- 2. Quick summary of activity
 - a. Here's what we're going to do.
 - You're going to take an empty bag, go outside and collect whatever natural objects you can find that can fit into your bag.
 - ii. Then you're going to use those natural objects to create a masterpiece by sticking them to a piece of cardstock using double sided tape and maybe some glue.
 - iii. Here are the supplies you'll have to work with:
 - 1. Point out the basic supplies
 - a. Glue, paint brush, soil, cups, cardstock

3. Instructions

- a. Now everyone is going to take their paper bag and head outside!
- b. Once outside, spread out and collect small natural objects that can fit you're your paper bag.
 - i. Do NOT rip off flower heads or damage living plants unless the teacher gives you permission.
 - ii. Here's what I collected!
- c. Pine needles, pine cone, soil, leaves, flower petals, rocks
- d. Here's what I made: Ta Da!

4. Wrap up

- a. Now it's your turn! Everyone grab your bags, head outside and collect your nature object! Remember, everything has to fit into your small paper bag.
- b. Have FUN!
- c. Think about all the nature that's around you that we don't usually think about!
- d. How did it get there?
 - i. Wind? Gravity? An animal? Human? Erosion? Other ways?
